Working in partnership with East Hampshire District Council and the Forestry Commission, we are seeking an outstanding, committed individual to continue to lead the programme in East Hampshire. East Hampshire is predominantly in a rural area with many areas of outstanding natural beauty. Candidates must be able to demonstrate experience at promoting cycling, physical activity or other community programmes to groups that suffer from increased risk of ill health through inactivity such as the disabled, ethnic minorities, women, young people and those on low incomes. Candidates also need to have experience at implementing projects and managing multiple tasks. Creativity is a key skill and the ability to work in partnership with a range of statutory, community and voluntary organisations. Recruitment, retention and training of volunteers to help with the sustainability of the projects implemented.
