Disclaimer:

Cycle trainers require a CRB check. From October 2009 all cycle trainers will be required to be registered with the Independent Safe Guarding Authority (ISA) to be able to deliver cycle training to children or vulnerable adults. The ISA role is to help prevent unsuitable people from working with children and vulnerable adults. The ISA will assess every person who wants to work or volunteer with vulnerable people. Potential employees and volunteers will need to apply to register with the ISA. Applicants will be assessed using data gathered by the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB), including relevant criminal convictions, cautions, police intelligence and other appropriate sources.
