## **Phil Liggett CTC Challenge**



More than 400 cyclists took part in the 2010 Phil Liggett CTC Challenge on Sunday 8th August – twice as many as in 2009.

Online entry, a fully-marked course and nutritional products provided by ZipVit Sport all helped with event numbers. John Radford of Huddersfield and District CTC was instrumental in the event organisation.

Former CTC President and race commentator Phil Liggett completed the ride just two weeks after his TV work on the Tour de France, and with few miles in his legs found it as enjoyably challenging as ever. Both the 100km and 150km take in some fearsome Peak District climbs, including Holme Moss and – for the longer ride – Monsal Head and Winnats Pass.

## CTC AGM & DINNER 2011



Hosts CTC Wessex are celebrating their centenary in 2011. As well as the AGM and Dinner, there will be rides for all abilities in rural Dorset on Sunday 15th May. Planning is at an early stage but there will likely be a visit to the village of Abbotsbury, with its ancient cottages and swannery. The potterers will be able to wander

beside The Fleet and visit the tiny 'Moonfleet' church, while the climax of the longer rides will be a visit to Hardy's Monument (right), which on a clear day offers great views across Poole Harbour, the Isle of Wight, Devon and Somerset.

There will be a treat for mountain bikers too: there's a wide range of excellent trails on Portland, from technical singletrack to wide bridleways. And there are no trees to obscure the views of the World Heritage Jurassic Coast.
