**ONE HUNDRED** years after the start of the First World War, the Meriden Green Memorial Service in 2014 will provide a national focus to remember cyclists killed in that conflict and others since. It takes place at 11am on Sunday 18 May at the Cyclists' War Memorial in Meriden, Warwickshire. An additional plaque will be dedicated by the Bishop of Warwick, and the commemorations will be supported by the Bulkington Brass Band. The weekend's traditional audax and leisure rides will take place on Saturday 17 May.

Organiser John Bennett, from CTC Heart of England, has planned an exhibition of CTC memorabilia from the time, and would like to hear from CTC members who could lend mementoes. There will also be a screening of Alan Bennett's 'A Day Out' and archive film footage on Saturday evening.

## **AGM & DINNER ON TRACK**

**CTC'S AGM** and National Dinner take place in Glasgow on 10 May 2014, a couple of months before the Commonwealth Games visit the city. Those attending will have the opportunity to ride at the Games' various cycling venues: the new Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome (subject to availability); the Cathkin Braes Mountain Bike Trails (bike hire is available, as it is at the velodrome); and, though roads will not be closed, the routes of the road race and time trial courses in the city. Sunday morning will also feature a programme of guided rides.

The venue for the AGM and Dinner is the Radisson Blu hotel, next to Glasgow Central Station and just 200 yards from the Clyde and NCR 75. A Volunteer Networking Workshop will again take place on the Saturday morning.
