# CTC'S 134TH BIRTHDAY **CELEBRATIONS**

FIVE HUNDRED CTC members attended the Birthday Rides at Ellesmere College in Shropshire this August, to enjoy a week of cycling and mark the anniversary of CTC's founding in 1878. Predictable wet weather for 2012 meant that the traditional Birthday Tea and cake cutting had to be held inside, but there was plenty of opportunity to explore the quiet lanes of the Welsh Borders.

For the first year, gpx files for the daily rides were offered alongside printed route sheets, and digital versions of both were emailed to participants beforehand so that they could plan their days. The route instructions were supplemented by guide-book-style information on the local area.

The rides ranged from under 40km (25 miles) to more than 300km (186 miles). All were very popular, due not just to the scenery but the lack of traffic of the local roads. The only downside was that cafés were further apart! Twenty-seven cyclists took a coach trip to Plowden in the south of Shropshire, making their way back to the college



venue via the Long Mynd or the Stiperstones.

### **Social occasion**

The social events of the week, which ran from 13-19 August, benefited from the fact that everyone was on the same site. Campers and caravanners were on the college grounds and those who chose indoor accommodation were in the college buildings.

Evening entertainment included a jazz band and a final night ceilidh. Ken Knight gave a presentation old slides, which he'd digitised, showing Shropshire CTC members from 1928 to the 1950s. He was afterwards presented with a Certificate of Merit by CTC Council Chairman David Cox.

On the Friday afternoon, there was a ride through Ellesmere by about 350 CTC members. This was organised and marshalled by the Ellesmere Chamber of Commerce. It was a great spectacle, with local residents and businesses waving and cheering us on our way.

This was followed by the Birthday Tea, where a presentation was made to Ted King, a former long-serving President of the Club.

The Birthday Rides were organised by CTC Cycling Holidays and Tours with help from local CTC members. The coordinator was Peter Mathison who thanks all those CTC members who helped, as well as college staff and the Chamber of Commerce members.

TWO HUNDRED and seventy cyclists tackled the toughest Peak District road climbs on 19 August as they took part in the Phil Liggett CTC Challenge Ride and Sportive. Two weeks later, 120 cyclists were in Clitheroe for the Witch's Curse Sportive, the penultimate event in CTC's sportive calendar.

The final event is the Tour of Worcester on 14 October. There are two routes: 92 miles and 60 miles.
